Prohibited Items

I, _____ [vendor name], hereby acknowledge and understand that the following items are ABSOLUTELY PROHIBITED at the Northern Navajo Fair, Fairgrounds, Rodeo arena, Vending areas, Parking areas and the Parade route:

- Weapons - including guns, knives, ornamental or historical knives, swords, pepper spray, and any other item that may be used as a weapon to cause great bodily harm.
- Alcohol
- Drugs and drug paraphernalia - including marijuana
- Merchandise depicting or representing alcohol, drugs, or violence - for example, a tshirt with a marijuana leaf.
- Toy guns and water guns.

Any person(s) knowingly engaging in the use, sale, or distribution of prohibited items will be prosecuted to the full extent of the law. Any vendor who violates the NNF rules and guidelines or engages in improper conduct will be asked to leave immediately.

Submitting Your Application

Applications can be mailed to the address listed on page one (1) or hand carried to the fair office located at U.S Highway 491 and Uranium Blvd. Shiprock, New Mexico. If mailing your application, please allow 7 days for receipt. The Vending Coordinators will contact you regarding payment received and any further information regarding your space within two weeks of receiving the application and payment.

**We reserve the right to deny sales of certain prohibited items, including but not limited to weapons such as guns, knives, ornamental and historical knives, swords, pepper spray and any other item that may



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be used as a weapon that could cause great bodily harm; alcohol; and any illegal drugs and drug paraphernalia. If you have questions on items that *cannot* be sold please contact the Vending Coordinator.

Space Assignment

Vendor spaces are assigned based on a first come first served basis. You may request a space; however, if that space is not available, then you will be assigned a space based on availability. Spaces are assigned by the Vending Coordinator and shall be marked during the fair. Requests for additional set up and tear down time for spaces must be made in writing to the Vending Coordinator. We require vendors to purchase the Event Long option if you need to build a booth. Fire codes prohibit the vendor spaces from exceeding their size and will be strictly enforced. Vendors who occupy more spaces than allowed will be charged for an additional space or be asked to vacate the fair/market.

Hours

The Market will be open from 8:00 A.M. to 10:00 P.M. Thursday, September 29, 2022, through Sunday, October 2, 2022. Vendor must be open for sales at such times.

Cancellations

All cancellation requests must be made in writing by the Vendor Point of Contact no later than 5:00 P.M. Thursday, September 16, 2022. Requests made through a third party or other officials will not be honored. Refunds will only be issued for cancellations made prior to the cancellation deadline. Cancellations AFTER September 16, 2022, will not be refunded.

Refunds will be mailed to the address on the Vendor Application and made payable to the individual/organization listed under application information. Please allow 20 business days after October 2, 2022, to process your refund.

Space Subleasing

Vendors may sublease spaces with prior written approval from the Vendor Coordinator. Please contact the Vendor Coordinator prior to September 16, 2022 to request a space sublease. The original Vendor Applicant (Sublessor) will be responsible for any damages to the space during the Fair.

Requirements

Temporary vendors must have current Navajo Nation Itinerant Permits and current Navajo Nation Area Indian Health Service, or 638 Program food handlers cards and must follow all Food Handler Training and Food Service Permit Protocols. Temporary Food Stands are permitted to operate under the same provisions as temporary food service establishment under the Navajo Nation Food Service Sanitation Code/Regulations. Permit and food handler's card are required to be displayed during operation. Vendors must also follow the basic Navajo Nation Covid -19 Safe Practices, 1) Wearing a Mask, 2) Wash Hands (Hand Sanitizer or hand washing station), 3) Watch Distance.
